We both made the trip together to St. Mary's to see the property. Father was excited to see this property and immediately had a vision and pure faith that this property would belong to the SSPX. He envisioned a school and a huge parish that would flourish for time to come. The two of us stood out in front of the property and made a joke that maybe they would use only 10% of all the buildings.

Father Bolduc phoned his Superior Fr. Kelly about the property. Father Kelly and Fr. Jachatta (sp?) both flew out to view the property. Father Kelly told Fr. Bolduc, I'm sorry, but this will never happen. This is something we could never afford and don't pursue any further. Father decided to make an executive decision to continue to pursue the property, because he KNEW God would provide.

Father Bolduc then contacted the Land Investment Company based of Denver, CO. The president, VP and their attorney flew out and met them at a very humble restaurant located in Rossville, KS. During the meeting the investment folks were telling father they needed nothing less than \$9 million dollars. Fr. Bolduc proceeded to tell them, that he had no money...only \$18 in checking account. Father told them he needed them to donate the property. Their jaws dropped from father's statement. The president of the company was indignant and very agitated along with the other two, and immediately got up and stormed out of the restaurant. I apologized to father because I was embarrassed that they reacted this way towards a priest. Father then told me, not to worry, they WILL donate it. Father's Faith never waved. We had a huge issue that needed to be reconciled. There was no heat for the buildings. Boilers needed to be put in. There was a Traditional Catholic by the name of Mr. Henry Beemster who donated all the money for this to be done.

Later, I found out from Carlita Brown who had typed of the Angeles and several books, that Father Bolduc acquired the Queen of Angels church in Dickenson, TX. The church had a huge hole in the dome. Father looked at the church and said we can fix it. Father was able to buy the church because of the donation from Mr. Henry Beemster. After which time, we were told that St. Vincent's Church in Kansas City was up for sale. Father Bolduc worked through prayer and had this protestant bishop purchase the property for (50K?) as a straw buyer. The diocese of the SSPX found out that Father Bolduc had purchased this property and they were very very angry.
