BAZZAR WITCH ACCIDENT, GILFORD, N.H. AP July 22, 1998

Police are investigation a bazzar accident yesterday evening at Giford, N. H.. Police received a call for assistance at 10:47 p.m. and arriving on the scene of the accident found a witch impoled in a tree. Police say the force of the inpact drove the witch's broom more than five feet through the tree. The witch, identified only as Broonhilda was taken to Lakes Region General Hospital, where she was treated for a broken nose, broken chest bones, and missing eight teeth. The home owner where the accident occured says he also intends to sue for extensive damages to his tree.

Police therorize that the witch was on her way to a witches meeting in an isolated, heavily wooded area near Morrill St. Residents of the area have reported numerous sighting of witches in the area in recent years.
