

In September of 1981 a four year liberal arts coulege program was commenced at Saint Mary's. The college is designed to give degrees in education, history, English and math.

Fr. Bolduc is also editor of The Angelus, a Catholic monthly published by Angelus rublications in Houston, Texas. He has held this position since he founded the publication in 1978.

Father Bolduc is the son of Mr. Mrs. Charles H. Bolduc of Morrill Street, Gilford, New Hampshire.

Recently Father bolduc announced the opening of a minor seminary in El Faso, Texas which will be geared to preparing Spanish speaking students for the priesthood.

Under the direction of Father Bolduc Saint Mary's College has recently acquired a 450 acre farm adjoining the college campus. Besides forming an agricultural school the land will be used to make the college and academy self sufficient.

Father Bolduc stated that his goal is to rebuild the traditional Catholic educational system in America by emphasizing the five "R"'s, reading, writing, arithmatic and respect and religion. Asked what the goal of baint mary's College was, Father Bolduc answered; "To educate catholic youth along traditional Catholic lines making them aware of their rich Catholic heritage and preparing them to take their place in the world as solid citizens that 'ill permit them not only to make a living but to save their souls as well."

So successful has been the Saint Mary's project that Father Bolduc is already searching for a second college property to expand. "we have already outgrown ourselves here in these first three years, he said."

Father Hector L. Bolduc, S.S.F.X. has been appointed President of Saint Mary's College. Founded by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1848, Saint Mary's College located at Saint Marys, Kansas, was one of the most prominent schools for young men in the country. Its graduates achieved fame and recognition in many fields. In later years the college became well known as a Jesuit seminary. The cream of the Jesuit theological and philosophical minds gathered there to form a faculty which drew students from all over the world. The Jesuits closed the large 500 acre, 14 building complex in 1968. Father bolduc acquired the property for the Society of Saint Fius X in 1979.

Father Bolduc attended school in Gilford and Laconia, New Hampshire graduating from Laconia High School in 1954. an early interest in history and art, Fr. Bolduc achieved prominence as a dealer and collector of art and antiques. Some of his collections have been loaned and displayed in museums throughout the country, After spending four years in the military stationed in Germany, Father Bolduc entered the religious life and began his studies for the priesthood. graduated from the School of rail sophy at The Catholic University of America and entered the Society of Saint Fius X in 1972. In 1974 Father colduc was ordained to the priesthood at the International Seminary of Saint Fius X in Econe, Switzerland by Archbishop Marcel Lefebvre. After returning to America Father Bolduc taught at the newly formed seminary of Saint Fius X in Letroit, Michigan. In 1978 Father Bolduc was appointed Provencial Superior of the South-west District of the Society of Saint rius X by Archbishop Lefebvre. This territory includes the management of priests and chapels in twenty two states including Alaska, nawaii and the country of Mexico. As Provencial Superior Father bolduc was responsible for operating and establishing more than 50 centers of worship. Among his accomplishments is the rebuilding of the Catholic educational system by opening and staffing nine Traditional Catholic Schools. Saint Mary's Academy at Saint Parys, Kansas opened its doors three years ago and now has more than 200 students who board or attend as day students. The high quality of education provided at Saint Mary's resulted in its students scoring an average of thirty percentile over the national average last years standard achievement tests.
