# Former Gilford Man Featured in Globe Article

The Rev. Hector Bolduc is the subject in today's Boston Globe of a feature article, "Catholic Underground in U.S. - How They Hear Latin Mass," by Bill Curry of the Los Angeles Times.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Bolduc of Gilford, Father Bolduc is superior of the Southwest District of the Society of St. Pius X, operating out of St. Mary's Church in St. Mary's, Kans. As such, he travels thousands of miles yearly, mostly by air, ministering to those preferring the traditional Tridentine Masses. The numbers of this "small but growing and dedicated flock" of conservative Catholics are now estimated at some 100,000 strong, who are "committed to deepening their church's hierarchy and the liberalization set in motion by the 1962-65 Vatican Council. In

private homes, hotels, banks, shopping centers, meeting halls and even in chapels, these Catholics meet whenever and wherever they can, ministered to by a handful of circuit-riding traditionalist priests like Bolduc.

The article continues: "Although Tridentine Masses may be said in some areas for small groups with the special permission of the bishop, Fr. Bolduc does not have such ecclesiastical authorization for his Masses.

Traveling not by horseback but by jetliner and car, these priests cover vast areas, often celebrating Mass in several cities a day and staying, like old-time circuit riders, with members of their parish, dining on home cooking and sleeping on a bunkbed here, a waterbed there.

"They bring to their far-flung parishes what traditionalist Catholics see as the symbol of the 'true church': the centuries-old Tridentine Latin Mass.

"It is a Mass barred in American Roman Catholic diocese as a result of Vatican II. Replacing it, in the United States, is the new English Mass, with some textual changes. The Council also gave local bishops the power to experiment with services.

"The church was to become 'relevant.'

"But not everyone accepted the changes, and now 'if there is a group that wants a (Latin) Mass, and we can get to them,' Bolduc said ..... 'we'll give it to them - regardless of size.' A day after he spoke, in the ballroom of the old Tiger Hotel in Columbia, Mo.,

Bolduc provided a full Latin Mass for exactly 18 people, seven of them from one family.

"(In a development yesterday, Pope John Paul II urged bishops to respect the desire of Roman Catholics who want Mass said in Latin and who feel the need for 'one language' - Latin - in the church.)

"From modest beginnings the conservative Catholic movement has grown. Five years ago, Bolduc alone served the Southern and Western United States while ministering to a 50-member parish in Houston, where the hardy band of traditionalists met so often in a freeway motel they jokingly called their church 'St. Travelodge.'

"Today, eight priests serve the region, with active parishes from

Los Angeles to Miami and ~~Florida~~ Washington State to Mexico. The week last month, groups in Charlotte, N.C., and Omaha ~~Nebraska~~ had their first Masses celebrated by the traditionalist priests.

"And the Houston ~~parish~~ meanwhile, has become the ~~Largest~~ in the nation, with 800 attending Mass weekly ..... (There is also a smaller Northeastern ~~diocese~~ providing the Tridentine ~~Mass~~ The society is led by French bishop Marcel Lefebvre, who was threatened by the late Pope Paul VI with excommunication ~~for his~~ insistence on providing the ~~Tridentine~~ time Mass."

Bolduc is described as "a tall angular man with a long, quick stride good for conquering ~~the~~ concourses."
