and Winter Shield II (Major training exercises) in which troops from several NATO Nations participated, SP/4 Bolduc served as interpreter for the General staff. He speaks French, German and Flemish fluently and has a good knowledge of Italian and Spanish. Hector modestly states that he knows little Italian; however, after completion of the training program, his commanding officer received a letter of appreciation from the Italian Military Forces expressing their gratitude for the fine job done by Hector as trans-lator at their field headquarters. Similar letters were also received from the Belgium Forces.

Other activities in which Hector participates include The Holy Name Society of which he is director, The Enlisted Men's Club where he holds the position of secretary and treasurer, The Unit Fund Council of which he is treasurer and the Rod and Gun club where he performs the duties of vice president.

SP/4 Bolduc is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Bolduc of Laconia, N.H. He completed his basic training at Fort Dix, N.J. and attended Field Artillery Training School at Fort Chaffee, Arkansas.
